WELCOME TO SAQI'S 2026 catalogue. For over four decades, Saqi has championed bold, vital voices from the Middle East, Africa and beyond. We publish for a global community of readers who share our belief that literature is both a gift and a responsibility – to one another and to the world we inhabit.

This year's list confronts urgent questions of memory, belonging, power and resistance, inviting us to look anew at the world and to reconsider our place within it.

Palestine lies at the heart of this season. Hala Alyan's acclaimed memoir *I'll Tell You When I'm Home* traces her intimate journey through motherhood, loss and identity, inextricably entwined with her Palestinian heritage. *Love Is Resistance* brings together 77 posters by leading international artists and performers – a powerful visual expression of solidarity, with all proceeds donated to the Ajyal Foundation.

Sinan Antoon's evocative novel *Notes from a Lost Country* explores memory and trauma through the lives of two Iraqis navigating exile in America. In *The Blood Between Us*, Robin Yassin-Kassab captures a pivotal moment in Syria's history as it struggles to emerge from six decades of dictatorship.

We turn to the roots of racism in Andrew S. Curran's *The Race Makers*, which reveals how Enlightenment thinkers gave slavery a new veneer of 'scientific' legitimacy, transforming prejudice into ideology. In *Where the Earth Meets the Sky*, a conservation biologist captures the stark beauty and fragility of Antarctica, showing how climate change is transforming one of the planet's last great wildernesses.

In 2025, Saqi became the first independent publisher selected for The Reading Agency's *Quick Reads* programme. Thirteen thousand copies of Leila Aboulela's novella *A New Year* travelled to libraries, shelters, hospitals and prisons across the UK – a reminder that books can reach places, and readers, where they are most needed. The year closed in further celebration as Aboulela was awarded the PEN Pinter Prize for her fierce intellectual determination to define the truths of our lives and societies.






The posters can be torn out, framed and hung, taken to peaceful protests or kept together as an archive. This art book also includes a double-sided fold-out poster, stickers, a signed set of Kyle Goen's iconic GAZA Love stamps and three posters drawn by children in Gaza, collected by the Ajyal Foundation.



What was an Indian prince doing in the retinue of a French envoy at Constantinople in 1796? When Ottoman Emperor Selim III, struck by the unusual sight of a fellow Muslim in a French cortège, asked how this Indian prince came to be there, Ahmad Khan told him his extraordinary story.

A Passage to Europe traces Ahmad Khan's journey from Gujarat to Constantinople, revolutionary France, London and back again. His voyage began in 1772 with the annexation of the coastal town of Broach by the East India Company; two decades later, he reached London seeking redress. The British government looked into his case, but although his tale was true, Khan was not the man he claimed to be. Arrested in Bombay for being a spy, he then simply vanished.

Rahul Markovits vividly brings to life the remarkable journey of this unlikely traveller's passage to Europe, revealing a story of empire, intrigue and deception at the dawn of the modern age.



The Crusades Through Arab Eyes

A new gift edition celebrating a landmark classic that reshaped our view of history

In August 1099, a judge from Damascus burst into the Caliph's court in Baghdad, denouncing its luxury while Muslims in Syria and Palestine were being slaughtered by Frankish invaders. With this incendiary opening, Amin Maalouf begins a sweeping narrative that reframes one of history's most defining conflicts.

Beginning with the sack of Jerusalem – where, after two days of carnage, not a single Muslim was left alive within the city walls – Maalouf traces two centuries of war, betrayal and resistance. He recounts the fall of city after city, from Antioch, betrayed from within, to Tripoli, besieged and stripped of its priceless library. Against this devastation, Maalouf sketches vivid portraits of those who rose in response, including Nur al-Din, the austere 'Saint-King', and Saladin, the reluctant leader who would ultimately reclaim Jerusalem.

Now published in a new luxury edition to mark its fortieth anniversary, this modern classic stands as one of the most influential works of narrative history of the medieval world.

This powerful memoir offers a rare insider's account of Afghanistan's past, present and fragile future, told by one of its most courageous advocates.


