This year, our books confront urgent questions of memory, belonging, power and resistance, inviting us to look anew at the world, and our place within it.

Palestine is at the heart of this season. Hala Alyan's moving memoir *I'll Tell You When I'm Home* traces her intimate journey through the crises of motherhood, loss and identity, inextricably entwined with her Palestinian heritage. *Love is Resistance* gathers 77 posters by leading international artists and performers – a striking visual testament of solidarity, with all proceeds donated to the Ajyal Foundation.

Sinan Antoon's breathtaking novel *Notes From a Lost Country* explores memory and trauma through the lives of two Iraqis navigating exile in America. In *The Blood Between Us*, Robin Yassin-Kassab captures a pivotal moment in Syria's history as it struggles to emerge from six decades of dictatorship.

We turn to the roots of racism in Andrew S. Curran's groundbreaking *The Race Makers*, which shows how Enlightenment thinkers gave slavery a new 'scientific' legitimacy, turning prejudice into ideology. In *Where the Earth Meets the Sky*, a pioneering conservation biologist captures the stark beauty and fragility of Antarctica, revealing how climate change is transforming one of Earth's last great wildernesses.

In 2025, Saqi was proud to become the first independent publisher chosen for The Reading Agency's *Quick Reads* programme. Eleven thousand copies of Leila Aboulela's novella *A New Year* reached libraries, shelters, hospitals and prisons across the UK – a reminder that books can travel where they are needed most. The year closed in celebration as Aboulela received the PEN Pinter Prize, awarded for her fierce intellectual determination to define the truth of our lives and societies.







What was an Indian prince doing in the retinue of a French envoy at Constantinople in 1796? When Sultan Selim III, struck by the unusual sight of a fellow Muslim in a French cortège, asked how this prince had come to be there, Ahmad Khan began to tell him his extraordinary story.

A Passage to Europe traces Ahmad Khan's journey from Gujarat to Constantinople, revolutionary France, London and back again. His voyage began with the annexation of Broach by the East India Company. Twenty years later, he reached London to seek redress. The British government paid his expenses, but although his tale was true, Khan was not the man he claimed to be. Branded a spy, he was arrested, and then simply vanished.

Following the elusive paper trail, Rahul Markovits brings to life the astonishing odyssey of this unlikely traveller, revealing a story of empire, intrigue and deception at the dawn of the modern age.



In August 1099, Abu Saad al-Harawi, a judge from Damascus, stormed into the Caliph's court in Baghdad, condemning its luxury while Muslims in Syria and Palestine were slaughtered by the Frankish invaders. With this charged scene, Amin Maalouf opens his exhilarating narrative history of two centuries of war that, nearly a millennium later, still cast their shadow on Arab-Western relations.

The Crusaders' first major triumph came with the sack of Jerusalem in 1099. After two days of carnage, not a single Muslim was left alive within the city walls. Yet it would take another fifty years before the Arab East mounted a united resistance.





Hala is not just awaiting news from the surrogate. She also holds her breath as Palestine and Lebanon, her estranged homelands, are under fire. She remembers family stories of grandmothers mapping their lives through a tangle of borders; of eradicated villages, invading armies and places of refuge that proved only temporary; of men who left, women who stayed, and the legacies passed down from one to another.

Stunningly lyrical and unflinchingly honest, *I'll Tell You When I'm Home* is a powerful story of unravelling and becoming, of homelands lost and reimagined, and of the intimate ways we learn to make a life when the ground beneath us shifts.

The Race Makers

A History of the Enlightenment's Most Dangerous Legacy

Andrew S. Curran

In the early eighteenth century, Christianity began to lose its hold on the story of humankind. 
N AUGUST 2022, activists mounted their final attack on Voltaire's statue, splashing another thick layer of red paint on the increasingly degraded monument. Shortly after this last incident, the Paris government announced that Drivier's artwork would be removed for repair and reconditioning before being returned to its rightful place. Four years later, the same administrative office released a statement explaining that the monument was now too fragile and would be replaced with an exact replica cast in resin. This plasticised Voltaire, which is more resistant to both Paris's weather and militants, now sits atop the original pedestal.

The downward spiral of Voltaire's statues in this neighbourhood — from bronze, to marble, to a mixture of fiberglass, epoxy, and stone — has paralleled both the writer's and the Enlightenment's legacy over the past two decades. At a recent international history conference in Rome attended by over a thousand people, a double session was provocatively titled: 'Should we burn Voltaire?' The French philosopher and writer is not alone in suffering such scrutiny. David Hume, Immanuel Kant, and Thomas Jefferson, along with a number of other writers and political figures from the era, are also being re-evaluated in light of their influential writings on race.

For many people, castigating these one-time heroes of the Enlightenment has been an act of liberation, a symbolic reckoning with a generation of men whose ideas and writing were tied to colonialism, slavery, or racism. Yet as satisfying as such retribution may feel, this act leaves a number of pressing questions unanswered. The first of these is: Why? Why did this generation of thinkers come to hold such racist views in the first place? And how and why did these ideas come into being during the eighteenth century, more than two centuries after the transatlantic slave trade had begun? Such properly historical questions point to an even deeper quandary: why did so many Enlightenment-era champions of tolerance and civil liberties work so hard to limit these supposedly universal birthrights to Europeans? This book, the first biography-driven history of race, seeks to answer these questions."
